

FREJUS ANTI BULLFIGHTING ASSOCIATION

Spanish bullfighting has taken place annually since 1905 in Fréjus. Six animals are killed one after the other and their suffering lasts approximately 20 minutes each.

In the first instance they insert



lances in the neck muscles to prevent them from lifting up their heads and to fight (let's not forget that we are talking about "wild beasts" here and not about grass eating animals...).

Next they harpoon and dig into the flesh with banderillas' thus turning



each movement into an additional torture (but the bull is forced to 'dance' in front the cape which

provokes internal hemorrhaging (corrida fans say this 'oxygenates'



him - or makes him feel better!)

Finally they finish him off with a



sword stroke (but rarely the first time around).

These acts are even more 'brave' and 'courageous' when the horns of the animal have been painfully filed down or when he has been weakened by heavy medication.



Is Frejus a dictatorship or a democracy?

However an IPSOS (very famous company of inquiring minds) survey carried out in 2001 has revealed that 86% of Fréjus residents consider that bullfighting is not part of their culture. 78% are against the total or partial financing of bullfighting with the

help of public funds (which is actually the case) and 62% are opposed to bullfighting taking place in their town.
